The new work of Francesco Patriarca is about the relationship between man and landscape. *Aggregates* is a metaphor for the process of urban expansion and technological progress that man perpetrates at the expenses of natural resources-

The exhibition follows an imaginary line that runs through the spaces of the Foundation and that becomes visual and real in the works exposed. Organic and mechanical elements coexist alluding to the process of urban and industrial expansion reached through the exploitation and fragmentation of the territory. Humans traces on the environment are represented through the subtraction of descriptive references.. Several interventions show the precarious relationship between and environment. between rational and natural. man The triptych Ethiopia Tryptich / Construction Site shows a detail of a construction site in Addis Ababa. This simple element refers to one of the main environmental threats of the African continent: the low cost and rapid growth timber used for construction eliminates the possibility of long - term forest policy. In Settlement wood series, a small aggregation of woods inserted into a geological landscape evokes a miniature city where buildings are constructed in an arbitrary way.
